## Conservation – Cheryl Shaw



### The 3 R's—REDUCE, Reuse, & Recycle 5 Steps to Reducing Waste

One dollar out of every \$11 that Americans spend for food goes for packaging.

- ♻️ Be a smart shopper and buy products and shop at stores that require less packaging.
- ♻️ Buy products made from recycled content when possible.
- ♻️ Buy products with packaging that can be recycled in your area.
- ♻️ Buy items that last longer, even if they might cost a little more.
- ♻️ Buy in bulk. You'll usually get your items cheaper, too.

At the April meeting, to celebrate April as "Earth Month" and to encourage the move to use less disposable plastic, LWC members and guests were given reusable cloth shopping bags from the Lilburn Farmers Market and reusable straws (with a cleaning brush). If we can use a cloth bag, we save 6 bags a week, 24 bags a month, 288 bags a year, and 22,176 bags in an average

lifetime. Conservation also purchased a supply of compostable forks and paper plates to use for refreshments at our meetings.

On March 21, I attended the **Lawrenceville Community Food Forum**, a networking meeting, sponsored in partnership with the Atlanta Regional Commission, the Food Well Alliance, and City of Lawrenceville/Gwinnett County leadership. Breakout groups discussed their vision of how Community Gardens bring together local governments and communities and how to create a citywide plan incorporating agriculture into the next phase of development. We also heard presentations from Atlanta farmers and food experts about the value that community gardens and farms bring to cities and neighborhoods. Lawrenceville is a finalist for a Food Well grant and has plans to install its first community garden site at Rhodes Jordan Park.



**Little Garden Kits ("Grow Your Own" Cocktail, Bee Habitat, and Tranquility)** are still available for \$12/each. These are perfect for small spaces or container gardens. Planting season is upon us!

\*Continue to save and bring to the May meeting: gently used shoes (Soles4Souls—ask your family and friends to help us), rinsed aluminum cans, aluminum pull tabs, used eyeglasses, used printer cartridges, and used mascara wands. Thanks for your support!

\*\*I've been asked why Soles4Souls is a Conservation project rather than International or Home Life (as I recently noticed in a Newsletter list of the Seven Grand Initiatives). The first information I saw didn't have each Initiative associated with the CSPs, so I assumed it would fall under Conservation since the shoes are all used—and that made sense to me!

**How does new business get introduced into a meeting?**

Once a motion is made, seconded, and stated by the presiding officer, it is time for members to discuss (also known as debate) the motion in an orderly fashion. Amendments may be made, the motion may be adopted, tabled, or defeated, but this is how ideas are brought before the membership.

New ideas don't have to wait until "New Business."

- After an officer or other member gives their report at a meeting a member in response to the report can make a motion.
- If correspondence is read and a member wishes to move to respond to that correspondence with club action, the motion can be made at that time.
- A motion can also be made after a program at a meeting which has triggered a desire for action in a member.

No projects, fundraising ideas, or outlay of money should be initiated without a motion that has been adopted by the membership.
